Sermon Text:

"...And the children of Israel took theirjourneysoutofthewilderness of Sinai...In the first place went the standard of the camp of the children of Judah according to their armies: and over his host was Nahshon the son of Amminadab."

Num. 10:11-14





As Israel
was guided
through the
wilderness
with the
cloud by day
and a pillar of
fire by night,

someone had to go first—to lead the others in step after Moses. Nahshon is one who willingly took the lead-off place and obediently followed. He was first to follow the command of Moses and first to set an example for others to do the same. Israel enjoyed great victories and successes early in her travels because of this prevailing attitude. Who will be first to follow when it comes to your church or youth group, or whatever area of ministry you are involved in?

Num. 1:54 "And the children of Israel did according to all that the LORD commanded Moses, so did they."

This is the spirit that carries great causes and great works for Christ; i.e. "according to all that the LORD commanded." Nahshon was the kind of person that is foundational in a church. One who was always there; always prepared; ready to go; to move forward. Please examine his qualities with me for a few moments and examine your own spirit as well.

First of all, Numbers 2:1-3 tells us that Nahshon realized and accepted the responsibility as captain of the tribe of Judah (v.2-3). Judah was a significant tribe in Israel. Christians need to recognize the importance and place we have in this world: that of serving the King of Kings and Lord of Lords. There is no higher purpose in this world than to serve our loving Lord Jesus Christ. We must step forward to take our place and to assume the task set before us.

We are Baptists with a rich heritage of leaders who had great influence on the forming of our country. Many of the freedoms enjoyed today can be traced back to the principles for which our Baptist ancestors stood.

For instance, 'religious tolerance', i.e. the fact that people may worship after the dictates of their own conscience was projected by the Baptists

in early America.

and to carry the torch for the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Adoniram Judson was the first missionary to leave the United States and serve on the foreign field. He went as a Baptist to Burma and wrote the dictionary for their language that is still being used today. He also translated the Scriptures for the Burmese people. What an example for others to follow! I believe he had the spirit of Nahshon as he dared to step out for Christ.

Next, Nahshon was first to face the new day. Numbers 2:3 says, "And on the east side toward the rising of the sun shall they of the standard of the camp of Judah pitch throughout their armies: and Nahshon the son of Amminadab shall be captain of the children of Judah." Just think: the first glimpses

of God's new day every day belonged to Nahshon and his tribe as they faced the east! How needful for those who would be leaders to be up in the morning to give their first moments to God.

Nahshon was first to see the light God gave; first to have vision each day. David said in Psalms 63:1, "O God, thou art my God; early will I seek thee..." Even Jesus found it of great importance to give the Father the first part of His day as Mark


1:35 says, "And in the morning, rising up a great while before day, he went out, and departed into a solitary place, and there

prayed." Are you willing to give your first and your best to the One who gave His first and best for you?

The last verse of Numbers 7:1-12, tells us, "And he that offered his offering the first day was Nahshon the son of Amminadab, of the tribe of Judah:" Here Nahshon steps up to be first to give offerings for his tribe unto the LORD. Each tribe was to make a sacrifice, but it is interesting that Nahson was first to give an offering. He did not wait around to see what others were going to do, and all the rest followed him. What a blessing to see Christians who take the initiative to give unto the Lord whether it is for missions, or for buildings, or other needs in the ministry!

The key is that spirit of Nahshon. That has to be the factor in your life. Look at the early church of Macedonia in 2 Corinthians 8:1-5, "Moreover, brethren, we do you to wit of the grace of God bestowed on the churches of Macedonia; How that in a great trial of affliction the abundance of their joy and their deep poverty abounded unto the riches of their liberality. For to their power, I bear record, yea, and beyond their power they were willing of themselves; Praying us with much entreaty that we would receive the gift, and take upon us the fellowship of the ministering to the saints. And this they did, not as we hoped, but first gave their own selves to the Lord, and unto us by the will of God."

Do you get the idea that they were of the same spirit as Nahshon? I want that spirit! Amen! (continued on page 5)

Num. 10:14 says, "In the first place went the standard of the camp of the children of Judah according to their armies: and over his host was Nahshon the son of Amminadab." Again, Nahshon is first to bear the standard among the tribes. God help us to step up and bear the standard. One branch of our armed forces says, "Lead, follow, or get out of the way." It is well known that the advanced guard needed to be stronger than those in the middle. When Israel moved onward and covered new ground, Nahshon was first to see it and enjoy it. He was first to face the enemy; first to fight the battles they faced. My friend, you need to stand up and face this wicked world. Fight against the attacks of Satan. As Nahshon, you can take the brunt of the battle.

When Joshua came to the Jordan River, he told the priests to step into the river, and the Lord parted the waters for all to cross over. God help you to be willing to take that step into new territory, gaining new ground for God in your own life. The Lord could use you to help others follow Jesus into a more pleasing testimony for Him.

Caleb made a claim for the mountain of Hebron in v. 12 and Joshua 14:12. He challenged others to step up and "take it." His nephew was first to speak up and take the challenge. He was known as Othniel. Sure enough, he got it done. Later Othniel became the first Judge in the land God had given to His people. Othniel led his people to a great conquest. Many of us are blessed with a goodly heritage, but perhaps you are not in a Christian home. God will use you to initiate a "goodly heritage" for those who come along after you. It has to start with someone. Why not you?

You may think you are not qualified, or that you are inadequate, or just too marred with a background not fitting for such a high aspiration. I want to tell you where Nahshon came from. He was the descendant of Judah and his disgraceful relationship with his daughter-in-law, Tamar. Yet in the book of Ruth there are some astounding words that ought to encourage every one

of us. Ruth 4:18-22 says, "Now these are the generations of Pharez: Pharez begat Hezron, And Hezron begat Ram, and Ram begat Amminadab, And Amminadab begat Nahshon, and Nahshon begat Salmon, And Salmon begat Boaz, and Boaz begat Obed, And Obed begat Jesse, and Jesse begat David." Pharez was the illegitimate offspring of the dreadful sin committed by Judah. BUT GOD, in His wonderworking grace that is still amazing, used even this humble and horrible beginning for His glory. You will see in the genealogy of Christ that Nahshon is mentioned. God, give us some Nahshons for Your glory! God is more interested in where you are going to than where you came from.

Be a Nahshon. Dare to step out for the Lord. Be the first to follow. Stand with Christ and His people. Take the stand for Him. Have the spirit of Nahshon!

My Dream Come True

Meeting Ron Hamilton was incredible. I realized that he is extremely humble. He barely took any credit for his songs himself. He said the whole Patch the Pirate adventures started because he was doing cantatas for adult choirs and the kids that had called him Patch the Pirate after his cancer told him he should do something for kids. It's not all about fame and money. Flocks and groups of people would be around him, but he still was personable. He gave a lot of credit to his wife and his team and to God.

I learned so much from the Garlocks, Hamiltons and Emorys. I learned a lot of musical techniques and how to express myself on the piano. I learned to feel what I am playing and to know in my heart what I am playing and not to just show off piano techniques. The Garlocks are Shelley Hamilton's parents. What a legacy they are to conservative Christian music for the past forty years! Now, Shelly is continuing with her husband, and their children are continuing as well. I am an MK like she is: a musician's kid! Don't get me wrong. I do not worship Ron or

Shelly Hamilton, but they have been my heroes and an inspiration to me over the past 15 years of my life.

My dream did come true:

I met Patch the Pirate (a.k.a. Ron
Hamilton). Now my dream has turned
into a vision. A vision of being a
blessing to people as he and his wife
have been and to do something for God
and to not do a halfway job but to excel.

Those three days at the music seminar have inspired me to work harder in the future so that I can be a great pianist for the cause of Christ and for the glory of God.





What do you want to be when you grow up? I wanted to be a truck driver. While we were on deputation and later while on furlough, I was always fascinated with trucks. I loved to watch the big rigs zoom past. I wanted to travel the country and drive my own semi. Wow, I thought that would be the life! Little boys sometimes fantasize about various occupations, and I thought that being a truck driver would be the greatest job in the world!

Then the Lord began dealing with me about preaching, but I wanted to be a truck driver. Even living in a missionary's home, I rebelled against God's will for my life. I thought there was no way I could preach. Then a missionary from Cork, Ireland, Lionel Smith, stayed at our house one night and asked me, "If the Lord were to call you to preach, would you surrender?" I told him I hoped I would, but in my heart I told the Lord no. The Lord kept dealing with me. He used a

verse in the Bible to quiet my confusion, "I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me."

(Phil. 4:13) I finally surrendered to preach when I was 20 years of age.

Of course, now I look back on it and realize how foolish I was. I wished I would have surrendered when I was younger.

When my folks surrendered to the mission field, I was about the age of 9. I lived with them in Ireland for ten years, from 1979-1989. Then in 1990, furlough was over and my parents were leaving to go back to Ireland, and I moved to Lansing, Michigan, to go to a Bible Institute. It was there that I met my wife, and I graduated in June of 1993. The Lord led us to North Carolina where I pastored a small country church. During that time, the Lord allowed my wife and I to make two trips to Northern Ireland to visit my family. Our first trip there, in October of 1993, the Lord led us to begin

praying about what He would have us to do. We prayed for over two years. I always thought the Lord would just have me pastor in the States and support missionaries, but on our second trip in December of 1996, I knew then what God wanted us to do.

While growing up in Ireland, my folks had us involved in the ministry leading in singing and doing other things in the church. I was never bitter about the mission field. I think the reason for that was when we moved to Northern Ireland, we made that home. My parents never apologized for raising us on the mission field. We never felt like we had missed out on anything by living outside of the United States. Dad always instilled in us that no matter where you are, it is always a joy to serve the Lord. When I left home, I had good memories of the mission field. When I moved back to the mission field as a missionary, I already knew the culture and the people. It was not much of a shock since I grew up there. I knew a little about how they thought, and it helped us in going back to reach the Irish folk.

Being a truck driver doesn't have the thrill that I feel from doing the Lord's work as a missionary. I really do have the greatest job in the world!





Chief of Sinners and the God of All Grace

(Editors Note: Nicole wrote this article for SAE three days before she was to board a plane for Kazakhstan.)

Whenever anyone asks me why God has chosen to use me as a missionary, the only reason I can think of is that I am the chief of sinners, and His grace is magnified when He chooses unlikely vessels. I grew up as a missionary kid in Brazil; however, in spite of all the opportunities and privileges of my upbringing, I could never produce in myself the faith that leads to salvation. I didn't want to go to hell, but in truth, I never really loved Christ, and I always found myself more attracted to the deceptive pleasures of the world. But then, in my later teen years, God graciously opened my eyes to see the beauty of Christ, and I found total satisfaction in Him. (I Timothy 1:15-16; II Corinthians 4:4-6; Psalm 73:25-26)

At Bible college, the Lord provided a husband for me to teach me even more about Christ and His love for the church. It was only then, after God showed me all that He has done for me in Christ, and after He taught me how satisfying He really is, that I actually became interested in missions. (Ephesians 1:15) At first, my husband and I just began gathering information about how God's church is spreading throughout the world, and we began praying for the peoples that have still not been reached by the gospel. Then, God began doing some amazing things in our lives, and eventually led us to a ministry among the Muslims in Central Asia, one of the neediest and most unreached places left in the world. We are so excited about moving to Kazakhstan in January. (Matthew 24:14)

People sometimes ask us what could motivate us to move to such a dangerous place and to work among such a hard people to reach. But when I have

found the most precious and satisfying Treasure, how can I not tell other helpless beggars the good news? When I have found Someone who is worthy of worshipers from every kindred, tongue, people, and nation, how can I not go and call out from the nations the worshipers that He deserves, and that He died to sanctify unto Himself? It is not just a duty—it is the highest privilege and an undeserved gift. I know that God does not need me-He could raise up worshipers from the very rocks, if He wanted to, but He knows what a precious and satisfying gift it is to serve the most glorious Master of the universe, and He is gracious enough to give us all good gifts-missionary service included! (Matthew 13:44; Ephesians 5:25-27; Matthew 3:9; James 1:17)

People also ask if I'm afraid I might die over there. Afraid of what? Going to see my Savior? Leaving all my sins and weaknesses behind? If God should choose to give me the gift of dying for His sake, then I would be overjoyed at this undeserved blessing. Jesus died to give me eternal life. I can think of nothing better than to follow in His footsteps and to die to spread the good news of eternal life to His people in Kazakhstan. Persecution, trials, and even martyrdom are no threat to the spread of the gospel—they are the seeds from which God's Church grows, and the conditions under which she thrives. (II Corinthians 5:8; Acts 5:41; Colossians

Yes, it is a difficult calling, and Satan and the world offer many trials and fierce opposition. But in the end, whether by life or by death, we will be on the winning side, and God will be glorified. In all of our struggles, up to this point, I have learned two things: however God chooses to bring His people through the battles of Christian life and ministry, the final outcome is always His own glory and His people's happiness. We cannot lose, because, ultimately, we are not the ones doing the work. God is working through us, and God can never be defeated. (II Timothy

3:12; Philippians 1:20; 2:12)

I imagine many of you who read this have a similar background as my ownyou grew up in a Christian home, and even though you have seen Christian ministry all around you, you find the pleasures of the world more enjoyable. If this is the case with you, as it definitely was with me, my advice may surprise you—stop thinking about what you can do for God and think about what He has already done you. Because the truth is, none of us can do anything for God; and recognizing that, and believing that He is the only one who can give you eternal joy through the knowledge of His Son, Jesus Christ, is the only work that He finds acceptable—for it gives Him all the glory, as the only One who is great enough to satisfy your soul. God has no need for grudging labor, done out of self-pitying duty. He has no need of any labor at all, but He allows the men and women who are delighted in knowing Him to have the privilege of serving the Savior they have grown to love. Pray that God would open your heart to see Christ more clearly and love Him more deeply! Pray that He would give you the undeserved pleasure of serving Him! There is no greater or more lasting joy than knowing Him-and for those whom He has given the gift of knowing Him, the joy of introducing Him to others, so that they might also rejoice in Him, is more than deep enough to sustain them through any trials that they may encounter along the way. (John 6:28-29; Jeremiah 2:12-13; Luke 17:10; John 17:3,13,18-24)

And they sing the song of Moses the servant of God, and the song of the Lamb, saying, Great and marvelous are thy works, Lord God Almighty; just and true are thy ways, thou King of saints. Who shall not fear thee, O Lord, and glorify thy name? for thou only art holy: for all nations shall come and worship before thee; for thy judgments are made manifest. – Rev 15:3-4 Nicole Weinert Pitchford
