

There are 41,173 verses in the Bible. In the 48th verse of our Bible, we read where God told Adam, "Thou shalt not." Immediately after creating man, God gave him a negative.

In the greatest moral code of behavior ever written, Exodus 20,

God said, "Thou shalt not," nine times. In 2007, there is a disdain for the words, "Thou shalt not." A preacher that preaches the "thou shalt nots" is considered a negative preacher. Friend, there has to be a balance.

There has to be a positive and a negative in a battery terminal for it to work. In our lives, young people, there have to be negatives and positives for your life to work out the way it is suppose to.

When driving

down the road and with an intersecting interstate highway, sometimes there places where the exit ramp from the interstate and the entrance ramp to the interstate are side-by-side. Do you know what is there to keep you from driving down the wrong road or from driving down



the exit ramp when other cars are trying to get on?

There is a "Do not



enter" sign—a red sign with big bold white letters. Do not enter. Thou shalt not enter. Have you ever gotten angry at that sign? Have you ever thought to yourself, "Who put that sign there? Why in the world would someone put that sign there? Why are they so negative?" No, no one has a problem with warning signs. We know they are

actually there for our safety.
No one has a problem with a

warning sign on a prescription drug gotten from the doctor. It says, "Warning: do not take this if..." You don't throw that prescription drug on the floor and say, "Who

do they think they are telling me I can't take this? Why do they have to be so negative?" Negatives are a part of life

May I remind you that even in the perfect environment of Genesis 2, there was a negative. Sin did not enter until chapter 3. From the very beginning of society, there was a negative.

"Tf the foundations be destroyed, what shall the righteous do?" What are the foundations? Two of are authority and work. God said to dress the garden and to keep it. In a perfect environment, there was still work. A hoe and a plow, not video games to play.

In Genesis chapter 2, there was marriage and family. There was a man and a woman. Eve was brought to Adam. Not man to man, nor woman to woman. Do you want to know what is wrong with our society? The foundations are being destroyed. Work is undermined. Marriage and family are being undermined. Can you imagine trying to redefine what marriage is? How stupid! There are no work ethics today. There are Christian lavmen in our churches who beat their heads against a wall just trying to find



men that will show up to work! In a perfect environment, there was authority and work and marriage.

I want to go on record for saying three cheers for the "Thou shalt nots." I don't have a problem with a church or a preacher that preaches the "thou shalt nots." I don't have a problem with a school or a Bible college that has rules and says "thou shalt not." Negatives are as much a part of life as positives.

I have three things to say about these negatives.

First of all, the devil always draws attention to the negatives. In this chapter, God told them that they could eat freely of every tree but

one. How many trees were in that garden? I don't know, but they could eat freely of them all except one. When Satan showed up in Genesis 3, the first thing he did was to draw Eve's attention to the one she could not have. She had pets galore—lions and tigers and bears, oh my! Editor's Note:

Moving at the age of sixteen to the mission field with his parents, Brad Wells came to the intersection in life where he had to make the decision for himself as to which way he would go.

Nothing about the intersection has changed much in the last sixteen years. It's still the busiest one in town, made so by the main bus stop to the west and the main market to the east. In our little frontier

atmosphere of Hagen, Papua New Guinea, you never have to wait more than ten seconds to get across. The potholes on the road, like acne, are fixed up every few months, but keep coming back. We all proceed slowly, carefully, not often taking in anything but the smoothest point from A to B. Today I watched the vehicle crossing in front of me plunge into the holes, causing the passengers comically sway from side to side, as if listening to some outof-sync rap song.

memory flashed mind, my as it often does, of the day sixteen years prior that I came for the first time to this very intersection with missionary friend, Steve Brogden. It was something he said that day that changed me forever-something about answering God's call. My answer to Steve was vague, but as we approached the intersection, the Spirit



of God insisted on a commitment, "So, are you up for the job or not?" At that instant we maneuvered our way into a hard right turn, and I said, "Yes."

With that answer, I gave up. I surrendered. I handed the steering wheel over, got in the back seat—actually, I climbed into the trunk, peeked out the keyhole and said, "Lord, wherever you lead, I'll go."

Every teen who finds themselves in involuntary full-time ministry comes to just such a crossroads. It's a three-way fork in the road:

- 1) You can stubbornly grip the steering wheel, demanding control of your destination;
- 2) You can slump in

the passenger's side, watching your parents drive, begrudging the rut of Christian service;

3) Or, you can willingly give the steering wheel to the rightful Driver and enjoy the ride.

If you choose the 3rd option, God has a map for keeping you on the right track. These directions from Psalm 119:9-16 will get you to the right place at the right time.

The million dollar question is this: "Wherewithal shall a young man cleanse his way?" How are we to stay clean in this world? The answer is simply, "By taking heed according to thy word." You've got to LISTEN, young man. Stop talking long enough to

hear which way to go.

ften, even after you have heard directions, you the find yourself going in circles. That's when we have to stop, ask again, and really start looking for the right road. "With my whole heart have I sought thee: O let me not wander from thy commandments." SEEK. You never look for something unless you realize you're missing it. Seek after God.

After you have found the answer, **MEMORIZE** it. "Thy word have I hid in my heart that I might not sin against thee." Don't keep making the same mistakes over and over.

You've got the answer, you know the way, but that's not enough. "Blessed are



thou, O Lord: teach me thy statutes." This is something you discover after Bible School. You have to **LEARN** what you know. It's the difference between the flight simulator and the Boeing 747.

Now, lest you become lazy and stagnant at this point, get a ministry of your own and use what you've learned. "With my lips have I declared all the judgments of thy mouth." TELL someone. By now, you are beginning to reap the benefits of choosing

the right path. Don't take it for granted: **TREASURE** it.

7ou have fought, **⊥** you've found the answer, and you've claimed the victory. You are in a perfect position to fall flat on your face. "I will delight myself in thy statutes: I will not forget thy word." The hardest thing to do in the middle of a wrestling match is to **REMEMBER**. During training, I had it down. But, when I faced my opponent in the ring, basic self-preservation

kicked in, and it was easy to forget the moves my coach told me would bring him down. It's called intimidation, and it's a favorite tactic of our enemy, the devil. Don't forget your training.

At twenty years of age, I made a hard right. Now, sixteen years later, this somewhat older young man is still enjoying the ride. If you haven't already come to the intersection, it's just down the road a ways. When you get there, take a right. •end







Family Love Notes

day I beginning this new article is August 22, 2007. I left home this morning to fly back to college for my junior year. (Oh, what a dear word—home.) My parents asked me to begin this column because of a wonderful love story Evangelist Joe Boyd told me this summer. With their permission, I will write that story in the next issue. This issue I want to feature another love story. One that is very dear to me. Today is my parents' 27th wedding anniversary, and I want to share with you their story...

The year was 1979. A twenty-two year old girl, Terri Koonts, graduated from college and left right away for six weeks to do missionary work in France. Having been proposed to amidst the emotional roller coaster of graduation exercises, she said she would pray about it and give him the answer when she got back.

n Tuesday, my great, great uncle Carl Lackey of Mt. Airy, North Carolina, said to the pastor's son, "Jim, I want you to meet my grand niece, Terri, Terri, I want you to meet Jim," and left them alone at the lunch table to fumble through an awkward introductory conversation neither were really interested in at that moment.

However, before four days had passed, they discovered they both loved to sing and that together, they

sang alike and thought alike, and blended together quite well. They had the same goals in life and the same desire to serve the Lord "whether by life or by death" as my dad's life's verse says in Philippians 1:20.
