Editor's Note: This message was preached by Dan's pastor, Dr. Jon Jenkins, at the Memorial Service on August 25, 2009.

f you have never been to a funeral of a born again Christian, you are getting a great experience today. In one hand we're crying, and in the other hand were shouting and praising the Lord. That's because as Paul said of old, "We are not like those that sorrow without hope." Our sorrow is real, but it is blessed and it is blended with hope today. Dan Firman was one of four men that died in this horrific accident. All four men were members of the Grace Baptist Church, so this has beenavery, very difficult



time not only for the families the Firmans, the Ericsons, and the Hunleys - but also the family of God's people, this local church, and I want to thank all other people from other churches that have been praying for us. Honestly, I am dumbfounded at

families and the church, and I believe is an indication of the spiritual vigor of this church and I also think that it is the revelation of what happens when a lot of people are praying for you. It's in times like these where you appreciate that you have a home church to be a part of. And I want to thank the Grace Baptist Church for your Christianity in this difficult time.

ow do you add to what we have heard today about Dan's life? Dan Firman was flat out incredible. Maybe you had just met Dan on a job site and didn't know him real well and you may be thinking, "Could anyone be as good as this guy they are talking about?" We probably didn't do justice to it. I've been to a lot of funerals and felt like they were looking far & wide for information to verify that this person was very significant for what they had done for the world, but that's not the case for Dan Firman. Our problem was trying to figure out how to fit it into 90 minutes.

Bro. Hunley and I were talking. All three of the young men that were with Dan were there at the request of their parents. He was the adult that they wanted mentoring their sons. He wasn't just a boss or a foreman on a job. He was the kind of man that they wanted their boys to become.

want to give tribute to this man. If I can just scratch the surface, I will feel like I've been successful. In Proverbs 13:22 we read. "A good man leaveth an inheritance to his children's children." The word "inheritance" in our old King James Bibles means "a heritage." It says in Ps. 127 that "children are a heritage." When Tammy and Dennis Firman dedicated their little boy, Dan, to the Lord 25 years ago, they were recognizing that he was, in fact, God's possession. He was loaned to you for a few years. Then Erin, the job he was raised





for, was to be your husband. You only had him a brief time, but oh, what a precious time.

week ago on Saturday, we did some remodeling to the front of our sanctuary. There were supposed to be only two sconces, but when Dan, our resident fellowthat-can-do-everything showed up, he said it wouldn't look right with two and that there needed to be four. When Dan thought we needed to do something, we did it. He put those four lights up there. We did not know that in less than a week, four "lights" would be put out. But God knew. Isn't that awesome? We plan to engrave the names of the four boys on the bottom of the four sconces. The four lights will remind us that four young men who stood out for Christ can remind us to let our lights so shine before men that we might glorify our Father in them...

Dan left something to us. Back in Pro. 12, notice vs. 2, "A good

man obtaineth the favor of the Lord." Dan Firman, in just 25 short years, did more than most men in a lifetime of 70-80 years and still fail at it. He obtained the favor of the Lord. This building is packed and jammed as a testimony that this 25 year old man touched us all. Bro. Dennis, Mrs. Tammy, Miss Erin, I don't know anything he could have done greater—he left behind a good name. Pro. 22:1 "A good name is rather to be chosen than great riches and loving favor rather than silver and gold." The dictionary's definition of the word good is almost a perfect description for Dan. I cried, I rejoiced. Have you even gotten a blessing from the dictionary?

The old Webster's 1828 Dictionary says that "good" is defined as: First, Of favorable character or tendency. 2. Handsome. 3. Suitable and the right fit. A lot of us think we were his best friend. His brothers knew he was their best friend. He was






the right fit for many of us. 4. Not depreciated. His value kept on increasing.

s that which can be relied upon. That defines him. too. doesn't it? 5. Agreeable, reliable, pleasant. Have you ever met anyone anymore pleasant? He always had a smile. He was so frequently pleasant that we probably took that for granted. Listen to this one: salutatorv or wholesome. We are saluting his noble life. 6. Amusing or clever. Dan was very amusing and incredibly clever. 7. Of noticeably

large size or quantity, considerable. Wasn't Dan considerable in everything? I remember when we started Grace Baptist College, and we were putting our buildings together. I thought, Dan is just a kid. He was a college student himself. We can't leave this big job to a kid? And then I walked into the buildings and saw the magnificent job he did and for about one-third the price of what others said it could be done for.

want to mention some good things about this good man. Luke 6:45, "A good man out of the good treasure of his heart bringeth forth that which is good. For out of the abundance of the heart, the *mouth speaketh.*" While our family was preparing our hearts for this sermon, I was reminded that just a week ago, our son was putting a light dimmer into our house. He called me and I said not to ask me. Call Dan. He will know. He told me, "Dad, I've worked with Dan in many jobs, and he never criticized anybody. He never said a cross word. Even when he thought people were idiots, he just smiled and went on. "Out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaketh."

112:5 says, "A good salm man showeth favor." Favor means: Pity for the less fortunate, merciful and graceful. I thought about the kids in Dan's fifth grade Sunday School class in our Junior Two department, and the kids on the bus that he was the captain of. A lot of kids have had the joy of Dan's benevolence. ... "Showeth favor and lendeth with discretion." I was thinking about all the time that Dan has lended to all of us. I wonder if I asked how many of us have had Dan fix something for us. I bet nearly every pew in this building would have someone stand up. He wired a light, he put in an irrigation system, he put a sink in, he laid a tile floor-Dan could do anything. Dan helped so many of us. I wonder how much money we owe him had he charged us a fair market value if he would have





charged us at all.


When Dan came to counsel with me about Erin becoming his wife, the things that attracted him to her were not just her beauty. He described her love for people and her sweet spirit and her servant's heart. He was looking at the right things.

A few Sunday nights ago, eight or nine young married couples came to our home. Around a bon fire, I challenged them to stand up and really begin to make something of their lives for Christ. Dan made the comment that one of his great desires was to win many more people to Christ in the next few months. One of his prayers was that the whole families of his bus riders would get into church. I remember last fall during the last week before the opening of college, Dan looked like a walking zombie. I inquired and he told me that he had not been to bed for over 72 hours. He said. "We've just got to get this done." I never would have imagined how true his next statement would be. He said, "I'll get a chance to sleep in heaven. Now it is serving-Jesus time."

et me read one more verse, Ps. 37:3. The Bible says, "The steps of a good man are ordered by the Lord and he delighteth in his way." Dan's birth on Nov. 17, 1973, was obviously ordered by the Lord. But let me say that August 20, 2009, was just as much ordered by the Lord. As we mourn our loss today, it is okay to ask questions. Just ask the right questions, like, "Why did God let us have him as long as He did?" "Why did God let him brighten our lives as much as he did?" Dan in 25 years touched literally thousands of people.


What made Dan Firman such a good man? It was because of his relationship with another good man, the man Christ Jesus. In John 7:12, Jesus was called a good man. 

My Father explained: "Since you are now my Son's bride, your name is no longer sinner. No, your new name is 'My Child.' I'm so proud to adopt you into my family!"



Trained by his father and his grandfathers, Dan could do anything—carpentry, construction,

electrical, plumbing, mechanical, remodeling, etc. The gift of skill and wisdom was upon him. He helped build our church in Charlevoix, the Bible Baptist Church. Many hours and days for nine months with his father and family, they worked hard at our church. They helped build the Landmark Baptist Church in Petoskey. They helped build the new building at the Rogers City Baptist Church in Rogers City, MI, as well as many buildings at his college and home church, the Grace Baptist Church in Gaylord, Michigan. Dan lived everyday as if he wanted to please his Lord. As Solomon had Hiram as his man of many gifts, Daniel was the Hiram of many churches. Dan worked for his brother, Dave, in a landscaping business. His co-workers said that every morning Dan would give preach them a message before they went off to work. Being the skilled carpenter that he was, he patched the hole from the inside but forgot the hole on the outside! Mom said, "Dan, be sure your sin will find you out!"
